HIGHLIGHTS OF MEETINGS

- SEPTEMBER** - Our program was given by Mrs. Doris Roney Bowers, from Decatur Il. serving currently as President of the Illinois State Genealogical Society. Mrs. Bowers gave an informative lecture on Scotch-Irish coming to the American Colonies in the early 1700's and the Irish sought refuge in the new country after the Civil War. She used visual aids to illustrate her talk. Mention was made at this meeting that all library materials be given to our Librarian, Mildred Devanny.
- OCTOBER** - The program for this meeting was given by those members who have recently attended various workshops throughout the area.
- Helen Gordy spoke on the workshop in Decatur, and gave hints on Court House Research and suggestions for writing one's own personal history.
- Brenda Jones spoke on Court House Research for marriage records and bonds and birth and death records are in the County Clerk's Office. Wills and Guardianship Records are in Circuit Clerk's Office. County maps are available at the County Court House or Highway Department.
- Helen Fink told of using Photography in Family Research. She displayed the various type of pictures including the Daguerrotype pictures from the 1840's. Hints were to keep negatives, have two prints made and identify persons in photo by Name, Year and Relationship. She also mentioned pictures should be kept in a suitcase, that could be dropped from a window in case of fire.
- Helen Stephansen and Emily Gordon reported on the workshop at Pekin; where they heard Martin Dieshler from England, speak on English Research and the various records available. Prior to 1837, all births, deaths and marriage records were kept in the Church or Parish. During the Industrial Revolution in England, the young people moved into the big cities, seeking employment. Other records made available are Probate Records back to 1400, land records and Guild (tradesmen) Records and Military Records.
- NOVEMBER:** Members and Guests heard Mrs. Henrietta Jesse, past President of the Illinois State Genealogical Society, speak on Genealogy and gave many helpful hints on doing Research. Mrs. Jesse related her experiences in doing family research in Ohio and Missouri. She also mentioned when seeking information, if there is not a local Genealogical Society, write to a Historical Society, or local Post Master or letters to the Editor in the local newspaper.

The NAME GAME

Many people, when they came to this country, could not write. Many did not wish to be labeled as "Irish," "Pollacks," etc. so they anglicized their names. Thus we have sudden name changes.

Other people, who could not write, when they applied for a marriage license, purchased land, or joined the Army, spoke their name and a clerk who supposedly could write put the name down as it sounded to them. There have been many court suits re: pensions, wills, land, etc.

Similarly, some people change the spelling of their name to a spelling which they like; i.e., MacDuffie became McFee, which later became McAfee, MacAfee, McFee or just Fee, or even Phee.

In some cases divorcees changed their name, even though their children did not. One of my grandchildren said he was going to change his name when they moved to another state. Nancy Hanks, mother of President Lincoln was known as Nancy Sparrow as she lived with her aunt, Elizabeth (Hanks) Sparrow and her mother Lucy m. Henry Sparrow. With women's lib, some prefer their maiden name, other for business reasons, so the researcher of the future may have trouble.

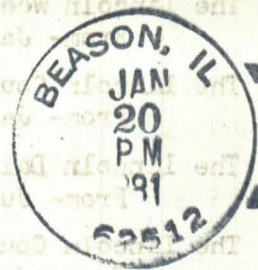



PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

January---The highlight of the January meeting was the election and installation of officers for 1981. Helen Gordy, member of the nominating committee conducted the election of officers and the candlelight ceremony of installation. The officers are: Emily McElhaney, president; Emily Gordon, 1st vice-president; Lester Wickline, 2nd vice-president; Lucille Henrichsmeyer, recording secretary; Brenda Jones, corresponding secretary; and Harriet Milleville, treasurer. Several members shared their various genealogical acquisitions. Bernadine Montgomery showed restored pictures of family members, Charles Spaugh brought many of his personal library items, and Helen Gordy showed her index file of births and deaths as printed in the local newspapers. Mildred Devanny displayed a legal document and asked for help in identifying the affidavit belonging to Mrs. Lucy Bates Atkins, 829 Pekin Street, Lincoln, Ill., and dated 1914. Lucille Henrichsmeyer, society historian, displayed the history scrapbook, and Helen Stephansen told of receiving a certificate of eligibility for being born in a log cabin.

February--Mildred Devanny, society librarian, presented the first of a two-part workshop on our public library resources and their use. She has listed all books in the Lincoln Public Library relative to genealogical research and information. She brought several books from the Library and had members bring their own personal materials. The latter were catalogued so that others might be aware of their availability for research.

March-----This was a continuation of the February meeting. Mrs. Devanny again showed books available at the public library, as well as several items from her own personal library along with still more material from the membership. During the evening members used the materials there as research tools.

APRIL BOARD MEETING

There was a discussion about having the monthly meetings at various locations in the County. We were thinking of a meeting at the Atlanta library and one at the Mt. Pulaski library. What do the members think about this arrangement?

TAZEWELL COUNTY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY LIBRARY

Lucille Henrichsmeyer and Emily McElhaney attended the Grand Opening of the Tazewell County Genealogical Society Library on Sunday, April 5, 1981. The Tazewell County Society has rented a room in the Chamber of Commerce Building at 116 S. Capitol in Pekin.

Volunteers from the Society will maintain library hours as follows: Mondays-6 to 9 P.M.; Wednesdays-1 to 5 P.M.; Thursdays-9 A.M. to noon; Sundays-2 to 4:30 P.M. The library will be closed on holidays.

The Society has purchased two microfilm readers and has 49 reels of microfilm of Tazewell County newspapers before 1926 and marriage records from 1827-1916. Grantor-grantee indexes of land records in Tazewell County from 1870-1916 also will be at the library.

More than 300 volumes will be housed in this facility, including 200 local histories, historical information from the late 1800's, county atlases from the late 1800's, volumes relating to research in foreign countries, and census and cemetery records.

The Tazewell County Genealogical Society meets the second Thursday of each month at 7 P.M., Parkway Christian Church, Dominion and Parkway, in Pekin.

Genealogy interest growing in County

Interest in genealogy or family history has grown by leaps and bounds since "Roots." More and more, people are delving into family backgrounds, trying to trace the beginnings or whereabouts of long

lost relatives and discovering those who were heretofore unknown.

The Logan County Genealogical Society began in November, 1977, when 17 women who were interested in studying their family history, met to hear Mary Fouts, extension adviser, home economics from Tazewell County, present a program on "Climbing Your Family Tree."

Her advice was to "write down facts, keep an organized file, and collect family stories in order to search out your roots." She displayed the contents of her "search bag" which she keeps packed and available when she has an opportunity to seek information at a county clerk's office, at a state historical library, at the state archives or when she goes searching in a cemetery.

Her "search bag" contains notebooks to be used for recording, a probe to use in searching for head stones that have been covered with dirt, a magnifying glass, pencils and a roll of paper to do rubbings on old, illegible tombstones.

The Logan County Genealogical Society has members who are willing to do limited research at the public library or the county courthouse for those who live away from this area who send in queries about relatives who may have lived in this area. Those who would like to have a query published should send it to Query, L.C.G.S., P.O. Box 403, Lincoln, Il. 62656.

Reunions good time for roots

Summer is coming up and family reunions will be the ideal time for beginners in genealogy to sit down with relatives and older family members and ask questions about family history. Tape recorders and a

supply of tapes would be extremely helpful, but if you don't have those, lots of sharpened pencils, notebooks, and a list of questions will go a long way in getting lots of valuable information.

Pre-printed data sheets and lineage forms, available from the Logan County Genealogical Society, can be very time-saving when recording names and dates and places.

Ask simple questions, such as when and where were you born? What were your parents names and where and when were they born? What were their parents names and birthplaces, maiden names, etc.? If they volunteer other information and stories, let them continue without interruption. Ask about early childhood memories, family traditions and stories which they might have heard from their elders when growing up.

If there are family albums, these can bring many memories to the mind of the storyteller. If photographs do not have the names of the subjects recorded on them, ask permission to do so. This is also a good practice for anyone who has photographs, to properly identify them as soon as they are taken. Wedding certificates, naturalization papers, land grants, wills, etc., can also provide valuable clues to one's ancestry. Old letters, postcards, and family Bibles may give many details into family history.

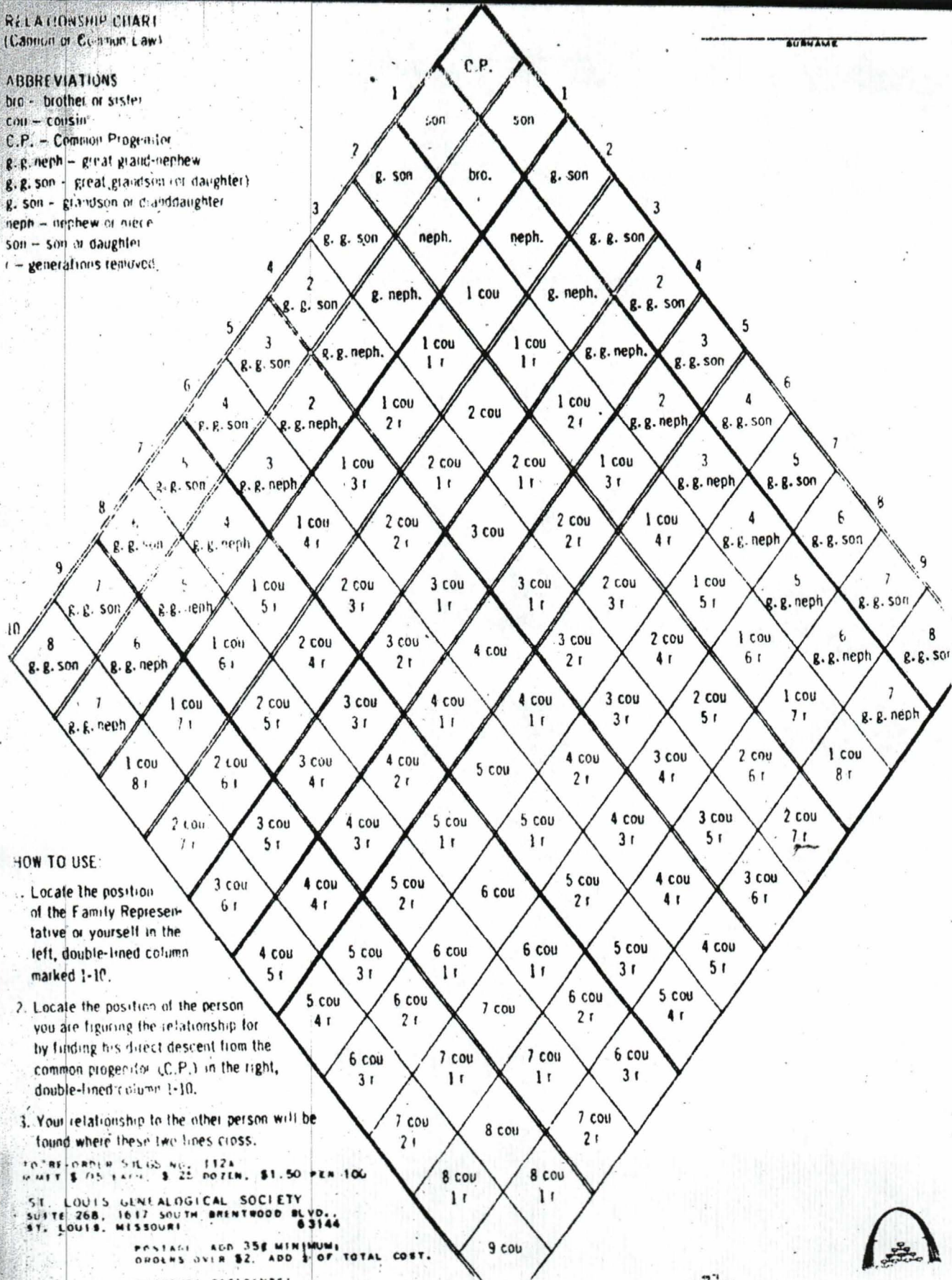
