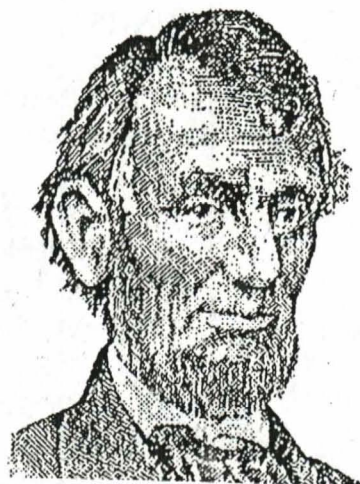
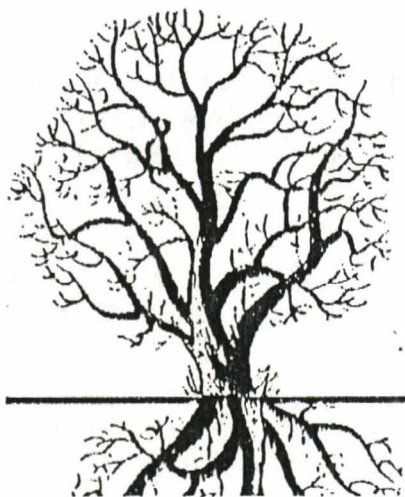

The year 2000 has arrived and it has already left its mark on me. On January 29th, my grandmother, **Fern Blaum Schrader**, died at the age of 94 years, 11 months, and 2 days. Her gentle and loving nature will truly be missed.

Grandma's cream puffs, homemade noodles, and pies were well known. I'll always remember her spreading the noodles out to dry on the marble topped table on the back porch. Now it was next to impossible to walk by that table without grabbing a handful of raw noodles to taste. How else would you know if they were any good. By the time Grandpa got home from work there weren't too many noodles left for dinner. He could be heard throughout the house saying, "the grandkids have been here!" Of course, it wasn't just the noodles we had devoured, we had also been in the cream puffs, the cookies or any other goodies Grandma had baked. What a wonderful memory.

Genealogy is the research into family. My grandmother was a source of family history. By the time I started asking about past generations Grandma had difficulty remembering some of the details and facts. Oh, I did gain some insight into the life of my great-great grandparents but far more was lost by not starting sooner. History is the preservation of what has already taken place. How many family events will never be recorded because I failed to take the time to visit with someone who had been there and experienced them firsthand. What experiences of mine will be lost because I failed to record them for my children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren.

When my grandmother died, I realized even more just how valuable she had been to my life. She had been the link to my father's childhood. She could have taught me so much about my great-grandparents and my great-great-grandparents, as well as the way of life she grew up in. She was the hub of the family from which our individual families emanated but yet remained connected as one. Her death has made me aware of just how important it is to record your family's history while you can.

Don't wait till tomorrow. Reminisce with older members of your family today. They are your roots. Record your thoughts and experiences for future generations. They are your branches.

Copyright Extended

President Clinton signed a bill which retroactively extends copyright terms for another twenty years, to 95 years. This means that materials written in 1923 which would have entered the public domain on 1 January 1999 will now enter the public domain on 1 January 2019. The extension of the copyright terms has a tremendous impact on genealogists. Newspapers (obituaries), old genealogies, county history books, historical materials, etc., published in 1922 cannot be transcribed and reprinted for publication purposes for another twenty years. People who produce free on-line databases and/or sell CD-ROMs are prohibited from reproducing materials printed after 1922. 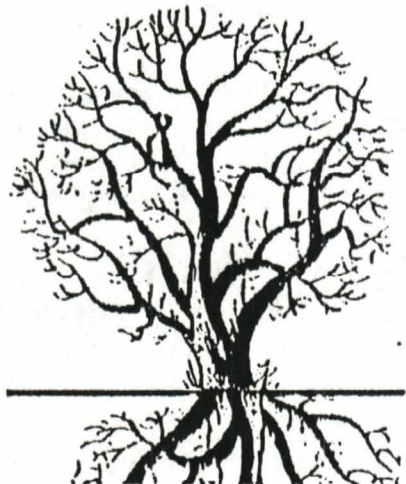

“Oh, he has your father’s eyes.” “Her hair is the same color as her great-grandmother’s.” “He has his father’s dimples.” Yes, we all carry some resemblance to someone in our family. Even our habits, temperament, interests and abilities can be a gift from an ancestor. It’s a definite. It’s genetics.

But what else have we inherited from our family? Hemophilia (inability of blood to clot properly) and Huntington’s Chorea (a neurology disorder) are two illness which can be inherited. We are told that we are high risk if a parent or grandparent has had breast cancer or heart disease. When the doctor begins asking, “Has anyone in your family had breast cancer?” “Heart disease?” “Suffered convulsions?” and so on, how do you answer. Do you really know with certainty the answers?

We spend a great deal of time researching family names, dates, and locations but how much time do we spend in researching our family’s health history. We gain valuable information from death certificates as to cause of death of a family member. The family Bible sometimes lists causes of death. Newspaper obituaries are another source of information.

Of course, we may run into such terms as summer complaint or Bright’s Disease as cause of death. Then we may need to do more research into what exactly those terms meant during the time they were used. On July 20, 1926, my maternal aunt died at the age of 10-1/2 months of summer complaint. It was brought on by teething. She went into pneumonia and died when her fever reached 107 degrees. My maternal great grandfather died of Bright’s Disease which was a kidney ailment. In later years, my mother underwent kidney testing to rule out the possibility of Bright’s Disease when the doctor learned it had been in her family.

Medical history is of value to both you and the doctor in diagnosing illness. Be sure to maintain a medical history journal as you research your family. It could prove very beneficial. After all, you never know when your “roots” may be needed to help keep your “branches” healthy.

A Notch Down

At our annual family reunion, my sister, an amateur genealogist, usually gives some kind of presentation about our ancestors. One time, she went on and on about personal histories, period costumes, and charts of our forebears and their native countries.

After what seemed like hours, she paused to ask, "Have I forgotten anyone?"

When researching through a genealogical book, always look in the front of the book for a guide to the abbreviations or where the data came from. Most books give a good legend, however, most use good, standard abbreviation. As genealogists, we tend to look at the back of the book first (the index) and then to page listed, skipping all the pertinent data in the front of the book. Remember to look in the front of the book before asking someone the question, "what does this character mean?"

Simple Method to Compute Tombstone Date

Person died July 4, 1886, aged 37 y. 7m. 4d.

Solution: Subtract days first, months second, years last

1. July 4, 1886 minus 4 d. = June 30, 1886
2. June 30, 1886 minus 7 m. = Nov. 30, 1886
3. Nov. 30, 1886 minus 37 y. = Nov. 30, 1848

Census Notes

If you have an ancestor who was a foreign-born citizen but you don't know when that person was naturalized, you may find some clues in the census. The 1870 census (column 19) has a check mark for "Male citizens of the US of 21 years of age and upwards." If the person was a foreign-born citizen, this means he had become naturalized by 1870. Both the 1900 census (column 18) and the 1920 census (column 15) give the year in which the person was naturalized. The 1900 census (column 18), the 1910 census (column 16), and the 1920 census (column 14) all ask the person's naturalization status. The answers are "Al" for Alien, "Pa" for "first papers," and "Na" for naturalized.

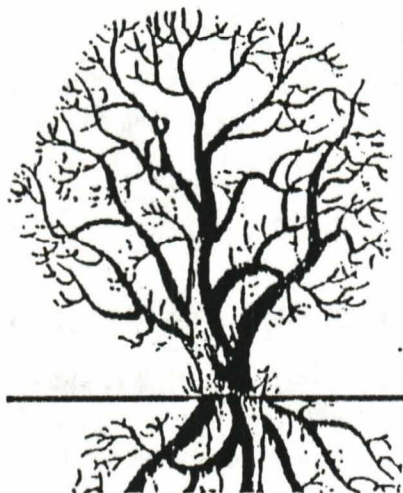

Have you ever kept a journal or a diary? When you were younger did you record your dreams, aspirations, and those special moments with your first true love? Do you maintain a daily journal now as an adult? Or do you jot down daily occurrences on a calendar? Some time ago when cleaning out a cabinet, I ran across several years of calendars that I had used to keep track of daily happenings or events. Reading through the notes I wondered how I ever made it through some of the days. I had recorded major purchases, not only the ones my husband and I had made but also our sons, such as a new car or a first home. There were also entries of appointments, births, deaths, weddings, and so on.

Then I made a grievous mistake. I decided there was no need to keep the calendars. All I needed was a listing of the major happenings. So I went through each calendar and wrote the major happenings of that year down on a piece of paper and then threw the calendars away. Oh, how wrong I was to do that. Sure, I have a nice list of the things I thought were "important" but I no longer have the real flow of the life my family and I had led each year - basketball games, school meetings, dental and doctor appointments, visits to family and friends, and so forth.

Am I so quick to throw out my calendars now. No, I'm back to saving them. They may not seem as interesting as my mother-in-law's. I'm certainly not butchering any chickens for supper!! But my sons and grandchildren may get to know and understand me a little better when they read them.

If you have never kept a journal, today is a perfect day to begin. Jot down the day's events, weather conditions, how you were feeling - healthwise or with things in general. Don't be afraid to "branch" out into new endeavors. After all, your "roots" will always be there for strength and direction.

In Memory of Virginia K. Johnson by Paul Gleason

The Logan County Genealogical & Historical Society lost one of its "star members" with the recent passing of Virginia K. Johnson. Virginia took special pride in two of her organizations in which she held membership in many in the area. She was a dedicated worker in the Logan County Genealogical & Historical Society and the Abraham Lincoln Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Virginia had valid reasons or interests in the two forementioned clubs. Check her "roots." They go back to Rockingham County, Virginia, and North Carolina where the family was involved in the American Revolution. Later migrations would take her family to Tennessee and Indiana prior to the Civil War. From Tennessee the family moved to Indiana. Generations later Virginia and her husband Paul would move from Indiana to Illinois where they brought their teaching abilities and taught school. Her husband Paul was a "premier basketball" coach until his sudden passing in 1964. His successful basketball coaching was illustrated when he took several Lincoln Community High School teams to the Sweet Sixteen State Basketball Tournament in Champaign. In a period of nearly four decades Virginia never missed that tournament.

Virginia is best remembered by this writer as a history and language arts teacher. She brought her classes to life through writing, reading, or studying American history.

Native Americans would have been proud to have known Virginia. She was an encyclopedia of knowledge when it came to teaching about the life, lore, or stories of the American Indian. She always said there was Indian background in her family. Kids always remembered Virginia as the Indian woman.

Likewise, in reviewing Virginia's family lineage one can understand why she was so successful in teaching the "westward movement" from the thirteen colonies across the mountains and eventually into Illinois. After all she was teaching about her family and it was only a "natural" subject to talk about.

Virginia probably held every position that was available at one time or another in the Logan County Genealogical & Historical Society. She gave each office her all through dedication and hard work. (At the time of her death Virginia was serving a 1st Vice President.)

In closing Virginia was a quiet mover among her peers. She loved people, her tea time, and, oh yes, her English bulldogs. Perhaps, most of her friends did not realize that at one time in her life she showed horses. Yes, the quiet woman that we knew was a participant in horse shows.

Virginia will be missed but her legacy will go on as her genealogical society continues to grow and develop. While she is no longer with us we who knew her will always have her in our memories as we continue to work with people in a positive way. That was Virginia's legacy to us. To her life the poem "Stopping by the Woods on a Snowy Evening" seems appropriate.

NOVICE'S NOOK

by Dan Dixon

The second most popular tool used by genealogists is the family group sheet. You need to know how to use this tool and what it looks like to understand how it works. Filling out this form is not hard if you keep in mind that the information is about one family unit. Follow the steps listed below and you will be able to understand the role of individuals in family units.

1. Always put the date, your name and address on the top of the form so that genealogists in the future may know who filled in the information on this form and how to get in contact with them. These identifying features also help you determine if the information is current.
2. As with a pedigree chart the husband's information is on the top part of the form. The entire name of the husband goes in the space provided. His occupation and other vital statistics go in their assigned places. All dates are listed in the following order: Day, Month, Year such as (3 March 1964.) A separate family group sheet is filled out for each wife's children. On this chart the wife is listed below the husband's information. Be sure to list all females by their maiden name. [Hint: Use pencil when filling out the form until you have proven the event as a fact.]
3. Once you fill in the information on the parents, it is time to enter the children's information. The children are listed by order of birth. Put as much detail as possible down for the location in which the child was born, married or died such as (Springfield, Sangamon County, Illinois). A label such as (, , Illinois) is used when no county or town is known.
4. The place for sources of information is used to cite or prove your information is correct. You indicate where you obtained the information for this form in this location. There are many ways of indicating the sources that were used for each bit of information. It is up to you to decide how you will indicate the sources used in the main body of this form. Some people place symbols such as (*, #, +, -) by the statistical information to indicate their various sources.
5. On this form there is also a place for other marriages of the children. Just remember to indicate the child's number when connecting them with a spouse. Separate family group sheets may also be made for these couples by following the steps above.
6. When the husband of the original family remarries, his new wife and any additional children are listed on a separate form. When the husband dies or a divorce occurs a separate family group sheet is made for the new couple or couples.
7. The following are a few of the abbreviations used in many different family group sheets.
b. = born, bur. = buried, pl. = place, w. = where, m. = married, marr. = married
chr. = christened or baptized, pob. = place of birth, d. = died, pod. = place of death
8. Remember, a family group sheet is made for every marriage that is listed on a pedigree chart. Play around with the different styles of this form until you find one that you are comfortable with and then stick with that form.

A New Nation is Born.

On the evening of the 4th of July the document prepared and written by Thomas Jefferson, known as the Declaration of Independence, was adopted by vote - thereby giving birth to a newly founded nation.

The Declaration was a true expression of the popular will. The people were not unmindful of the gravity of the step they were taking, of the vast responsibility they were assuming. They knew that a long bloody war must follow-that it meant untold suffering and sacrifice, vacant chairs at the family fireside, widowed mothers and fatherless children. But they took no step backward. They saw in the dim future a new nation born, commercial and political freedom and self-government. "America was never so great" says a famous writer, "as on the day when she declared her independence."

The American's Creed

National Politics in Lincoln and Logan County 1916-1948

In reviewing the political activities of Logan County from 1916 to 1948 one can observe that Lincoln and Logan County have not always been happy hunting grounds for the Democrats as revealed by the election returns of that period.

The year 1916 was considered to be the beginning of the present era in national and world affairs and likewise Lincoln and Logan County could not escape from international events. In the eight national elections from 1916 through 1944 the Democrats have only carried Logan County twice for their presidential and gubernatorial candidates. Those two occasions were in 1932 and 1936 when Franklin D. Roosevelt was at the height of his popularity.

In the election of 1916 the guns were blasting away in Europe. The nation had maintained its neutrality and Woodrow Wilson won a close election on the theme "He kept us out of war." In spite of that Lincoln and Logan County supported Charles Evans Hughes, the Republican

nominee by slightly less than 200 votes. Hughes received 5,933 and Wilson had 5,721. The relationship of those two tallies reflected how close the national election was. It was noted in the Lincoln-Herald that the German press was pleased with the results. They believed that Wilson's election insured continued American neutrality.

With the war over by 1920 the nation thought that it was time for a change. The Republican Warren G. Harding defeated the Democratic candidate Governor Cox of Ohio. In Logan County the votes totaled 7,008 for Harding and 3,299 for Cox.

The presidential election of 1924 was a three way race. "Silent Cal" Coolidge who had been elected vice president under Harding and assumed the presidency after the latter's death received 6,742 votes in the city and county. The Democratic candidate John W. Davis received 5,587 votes while the Progressive candidate Robert LaFollette had 1,471 votes. In the governor's race that year Governor Len Small, the Republican candidate for re-election was beaten by his Democratic challenger Norman L. Jones,

6,194 votes to 5,589 votes for Small. Small went on and captured the governorship after all the votes in the state were totaled. His margin of victory was 300,000 votes. That election was the only time in the period of 1916-1948 that Lincoln and Logan County had backed a losing Democratic candidate.

The 1928 national election pitted Republican Herbert Hoover against Al ("Let's take a look at the record") Smith. Prohibition was in and the nation was closing the decade of the "Roaring Twenties." Hoover received 7,631 votes in the city and county as compared to Al Smith's 5,011. The Republican Louis Emmerson beat Floyd Thompson for governor by a vote of 6,827 to 5,414.

The year 1932 was Franklin D. Roosevelt's year in Logan County. He defeated Hoover 8,119 to 5,850 in the city and county. The two leading factors in F.D.R.'s victory were the Stock Market Crash of 1929 and the Great Depression which followed. Henry Horner, a Democrat, defeated Len Small, Republican, in the race for governor in Logan County and went on to carry the state as well. In Logan County the results were 7,289 to 6,484.

Roosevelt received the majority of the votes cast in Lincoln and Logan County again in 1936. His opponent was Alf Landon and the results showed 7,886 votes for Roosevelt and 7,117, votes for his opponent.

Governor Horner beat the Republican C. Wayland Brooks for the governorship. He had 7,911 Logan County votes as compared to 6,929 votes for Brooks.

Changes occurred in Logan County when the voters decided that two terms were enough for Roosevelt. They gave

the Republican candidate Wendell Willkie 8,939 votes to Roosevelt's 6,764. The nation gave Roosevelt his third term. Eight years of Democratic rule in the governor's office ended when Dwight Green defeated the Democrat Harry B. Hershey on the state level. In the city and Logan County Green had 8,782 votes as compared to Hershey's 6,761.

The 1944 presidential election witnessed a further decline of the Roosevelt votes in his quest for the fourth term which he went on to win. Logan County reverted fully to the traditional Republicanism in 1944 and gave Thomas E. Dewey 7,975 votes to F.D.R.'s 4,889. The Republican Dwight Green was returned to the governorship of Illinois and received 7,941 votes. The Democratic candidate I. J. Courtney got 4,685 votes.

Four years later the presidential race was close for the results to have been known. The Chicago Tribune of November 3, 1948 headlined Dewey as the winner. Both Truman and Dewey barnstormed the nation in October in their quest for the White House. The Truman train became known as the "White House Special," and the Dewey train was the "Dewey Victory Special."

After the campaign was over the results gave President Truman the election victory in spite of the premature Chicago Tribune headline. In Lincoln and Logan County President Truman was given 4,837 votes while Dewey received 7,441 votes. Democrat Adlai E. Stevenson had 5,299 votes locally for governor of Illinois. His opponent Dwight Green was given 6,812 votes. Stevenson carried the state.

Logan County Genealogical & Historical Society, Inc.
Constitution

Article I. Name

The name of this organization shall be The Logan County Genealogical & Historical Society, Inc. It is a non-profit, Federal tax exempt organization, chartered by the State of Illinois, and hereinafter shall be referred to as the Society.

Article II. Purpose

Section 1. To stimulate an interest in the genealogy and history of the people who contributed to the establishment and development of our nation.

Section 2. To seek, preserve and make available to all persons the genealogical and historical data pertaining to those who lived in Logan County and to the incidents and events which took place here and in our country.

Section 3. To receive, hold and invest all monies received by the Society, to hold and administer property for the benefit of the Society and for the educational purposes as provided in Section 501 (C) (3) of the 1954 Internal Revenue Code of the State of Illinois.

Article III. Membership

Section 1. There shall be the following classes of membership as decided by the Executive Board.

1. Charter Member - Society member prior to December 31, 1978
2. Individual Membership - one person in a household
3. Family Membership - more than one person using the same address
4. Lifetime Membership - Paid as a single lifetime membership or as a couple lifetime membership at the rate(s) set at the time of enrollment.
5. ~~Contributing Member - pays an amount over and above the regular membership fee~~

Article IV. Officers

The officers of the Society shall be such officers or committees as the Bylaws of this Constitution may prescribe.

Article V. Property Rights

This Society may receive, acquire, hold title to and manage such real estate and other properties as it may need to accomplish its purpose and may sell or dispose of such real estate and other property or any part thereof. The Society shall have all rights and powers that are granted by the State of Illinois to non-profit corporations.

Article VI. Dissolution

Section 1. Upon the dissolution of the Society, the officers who serve as the Executive Board, shall after paying or making provisions for the payment of all liabilities of the Society, offer the assets of the Society to the Illinois State Genealogical Society, or if the Illinois State Genealogical Society does not exist, the assets shall be offered to the Illinois State Historical Library, or to an organization or organizations charitable or scientific purposes which qualified as an exempt organization under Section 501 (C) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future Internal Revenue Law).

Section 2. All assets not disposed of, as designated in Article VI, Section 1, shall be disposed of by the Logan County Court of Common Pleas, where the Society is located, exclusively for such organization(s) as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes under Section 501 (C) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future Internal Revenue Law).

Article VII. Bylaws

The Society may adopt such Bylaws as may be required for the accomplishment of its purpose.

Article VII. Amendments and Revisions

Section 1. A ~~five (5)~~ *three (3)* member committee shall be appointed every third year from the last revision of the Constitution and Bylaws. This committee shall report any suggested changes to the Board for their consideration. If changes are to be made, a copy of same shall be published in the next soonest Quarterly sent to the membership and shall be voted on at the next regularly scheduled meeting. The vote shall be a simple majority of members present.

Section 2. Any member ~~in good standing~~ may present, in writing, an amendment to the *Constitution and Bylaws to the Executive Board* ~~Corresponding Secretary~~. If the amendment is approved by the Executive Board, the proposed amendment shall be mailed via the Quarterly and voted upon at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

Article IX. Parliamentary Authority

Robert's Rules of Order shall govern in all matters not specified in the Constitution and Bylaws of the organization.

Bylaws**Article I. Member's Rights and Responsibilities**

Section 1. *Any person or persons wishing to become a member of the Society may do so, regardless of their ability to pay dues.*

Section 2. Each ~~household membership~~ is entitled to receive all four (4) issues of the Society's Quarterly, "Roots and Branches." *All enrollees are entitled to four issues, though some may join during the year. in mid-year or later.*

Section 3. Membership year is from January 1 to December 31. *Dues shall be evaluated periodically, and rates Membership dues shall be established by the Executive Board with the approval of a majority vote of the members present.*

Section 4. *Members who have not paid their dues by March 1 of the year owed will be removed from the membership list.*

Section 5. A member may be suspended or expelled from the Society by a 2/3 vote of the Executive Board. *Just cause for such action would include for insubordination or misappropriation of funds, or one whose interest conflicts with that of the Society's purpose. Any member so rejected may file an appeal with the Executive Board.*

Section 6. *Honorary membership may be bestowed upon an individual by the members-at-large.*

Article II. Meetings

Section 1. Regular meetings of this Society shall be held monthly except *when otherwise determined by the Executive Board in December.*

Section 2. The date, time and place is to be decided by the Executive Board.

Section 3. *Topics and programs for regular meetings will be developed through the Executive Board. Society members will be encouraged to suggest program topics and to aid in soliciting program presenters.*

Section 4. *The Executive Board may recommend a dues increase when it is deemed necessary. The recommendation will then be brought before the members-at-large at the next regularly convened business meeting to be voted upon.*

Section 5. *The Executive Board will evaluate, select, acquire, and maintain genealogical and historical material for the research center. It will also be responsible to oversee all of the Society's holdings; maintain regularly scheduled hours in the research center; enlist volunteers*

to assist when necessary in matters pertaining to the research center and historical museum; and to supervise all workers, i.e. Green Thumb workers.

Article III. Election of Officers

Section 1. A Nominating Committee of ~~three (3) members~~ shall be named at the September meeting. It shall consist of two (2) officers and one (1) member at large, elected by the membership. ~~The committee shall receive a list of all members in good standing, from the Membership Committee and select a corps of officers who may be elected and installed at the annual meeting. (Nominations from the floor will also be permitted.)~~

Section 2. The Nominating Committee shall present a slate of officers to be voted on at the Annual Meeting. No name will be submitted without the candidate's prior consent.

Section 3. *The President will call for nominations from the floor.*

Section 4. *A vote will be taken from the members present. The majority vote rules.*

Section 5. *New officers will be installed at the first regular meeting of the new election year.*

Article IV. Officers

Section 1. The elected officers of this Society shall be the President, ~~First Vice President, Second Vice President,~~ Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer.

All officers shall be members ~~in good standing and~~ at least 18 years of age.

Section 2. *In the event Co-Presidents are elected, a Vice President would not be required.*

Section 3. Any elected officer may be removed or suspended from office if found guilty of dereliction of duty by the Executive Board.

Section 4. No member shall hold more than one elective office at a time. No *officer President* shall serve more than two consecutive terms unless the nominating committee is unable to find a qualified replacement.

Section 5. *The Society's legal representatives shall be the President, Vice President, or Co-Presidents, and Treasurer.*

Article V. Terms of Office

Section 1. Officers shall be elected to serve for a term of two years. Elections shall be held every other year with new officer terms to begin at the close of the Annual Meeting, *usually held in November.*

Section 2. All committees selected by the new President shall serve a term of two (2) years unless otherwise specified at the time of ~~election~~ *appointment.*

Article VI. The Executive Board

Section 1. The Executive Board shall consist of the elected officers plus the immediate past President, one former past President and a representative from the regular membership, with the approval of the Executive Board.

Section 2. The *Executive Board* shall meet monthly or as necessary to transact Society business ~~between regular meetings.~~ The time and place of said meetings shall be selected by the President. *Executive Board* members shall be notified by mail or phone five (5) days in advance, or if acceptable to the members, the five days may be ~~set aside~~ *waived* and the meeting held *as necessary for the purpose of conducting business of the Society at their convenience as decided by the majority of the Executive Board.*

Article VII. Vacancies

In the event of resignation or illness of any officer, such vacancy shall be filled by the Executive Board for the remainder of the term.

Article VIII. Duties of OfficersSection 1. The President:

1. shall preside at all meetings of the Society and Executive Board
2. appoints all committees *that will serve a term in succession with the President's unless determined otherwise; i.e., needed for a limited time of service*
3. serves as ex-officio member of all committees, except the nominating committee
4. exercises general supervision over the officers and committees
5. ~~The President~~ shall be authorized to sign checks in the absence of the Treasurer and execute all contracts, deeds or other legal instruments as permitted by the Executive Board.

Section 2. ~~The First Vice President shall perform all the duties of the President in the President's absence of that officer or their inability to serve and is also the Program Chairman.~~

Section 3. ~~The Second Vice President is chairman of membership and shall keep a current list of paid members informing other officers and the membership as requested.~~

Section 3. The Recording Secretary:

1. shall serve as the Registered Agent of the Society and shall have the custody of the official Corporate Seal of the Society
2. is to accurately record all the proceedings of the regular and the Executive Board meetings
3. shall read the minutes as directed by the President, *and maintain same as a part of the permanent record.*
4. shall attest all contracts, deeds and other legal instruments as authorized by the Executive Board.
5. In the absence of the President and Vice-President ~~three (3) elected top officers~~, the Secretary shall preside at the meetings.

Section 4. The Corresponding Secretary:

1. shall, on a regular basis and as directed by the President of the Society, ~~pick up~~ *handle* all the mail ~~received from the post office shall hold the only key to the post office box;~~ and distribute the mail to the proper officers
2. shall conduct correspondence as requested by the President and shall keep a file of all correspondence, received and mailed out
3. will be responsible for the filling and mailing, in a timely manner, of all book orders

Section 5. The Treasurer:

1. receives all monies for the Society and distributes it as authorized by the Executive Board, *or by a majority vote of the members at large during a regular meeting*
2. keeps an accurate accounting of all funds and makes necessary disbursements as directed
3. presents a detailed financial report to the Executive Board, regular and annual meetings *and provides a copy to be placed on file*
4. is subject to the supervision of the Executive Board.
~~In the absence of the top (4) elected officers, the Treasurer shall conduct the meetings of the membership and the Executive Board.~~
5. *shall submit for audit all financial Treasurer's records of the Society to the Auditing Committee 30 days before the annual meeting by an auditing committee appointed by the President, consisting of one (1) Executive Board member and two (2) members at large. The Auditing Committee shall be appointed at the September meeting.*

~~The Treasurer must surrender to the auditing committee the complete set of accounts, a list of all Society assets, and any other items concerning the office, and shall turn over all Society properties~~

6. shall turn over all financial records to the new Treasurer following the annual meeting.

Article IX. Committees Special Appointments

(The President appoints the following committees as approved by a majority of the members of the Executive Board.)

Section 1. The Auditing Committee

The committee shall be appointed at the regular membership meeting in September. The Auditing Committee shall consist of one (1) member from the *Executive Board* and two (2) members at large. They shall complete an audit of the Treasurer's accounts *30 days before the Annual Meeting. Any discrepancies found during the audit shall be reported immediately to the President. The Executive Board shall decide if any action is to be taken. and submit a signed An audit report signed by all members of the Auditing Committee shall become part of the Society's permanent record.*

Section 2. The Quarterly Editor

The Quarterly, "Roots and Branches," shall be published four (4) times a year - Spring, Summer, Fall, Winter.

The Editor of the Quarterly may select members to assist in the duties of locating and selecting worthwhile articles appealing to genealogists and historians alike; shall assist in the printing ~~distribution~~ and mailing of the publication as recommended by the Executive Board. Only one Quarterly shall be mailed to each household. (~~Family memberships are entitled to only one Quarterly.~~)

The exchanging of publications with other Societies shall be on a limited basis and coordinated by the Editor, the President and the Executive Board.

Section 3. Genealogist

The Genealogist shall do limited research as requested by the correspondents, answer specific requests and shall surrender all records to his/her successor. Any monies received for researching shall be turned in to the Treasurer. *A file of the correspondence shall be kept for the purpose of continual research of a given surname for the benefit of genealogists.*

Section 4. Public Relations Person or Committee

The President shall appoint a Public Relations Person or Committee to write and distribute news releases to area media sources announcing information in regard to all meetings, events and happenings of the Society. ~~advertises and publicizes events and publications of the Society as directed.~~

Section 5. Historian

The Historian shall be appointed ~~as deemed advisable~~ by the President. The Historian shall compile a historic scrapbook of yearly events, happenings and published articles. The scrapbook shall be available at meetings for viewing and to keep members aware of the importance of preserving these articles and the history of the Society. ~~and perform such duties as directed by the Executive Board.~~
